One of my favorite days to gather for Eucharist is Thanksgiving. It always has been. There is something profoundly moving about the rich imagery of Thanksgiving and how it speaks to the heavenly banquet of which we are all invited to be a part. Thanksgiving Day itself is a major church holy day and a national day in the Book of Common Prayer. The Proposed Prayer Book of 1786 included,

"A Form of Prayer and Thanksgiving to Almighty God, for the Fruits of the Earth, and all the other Blessings of his merciful Providence"

(National Church Archives).

In the prayer book of today, this has been incorporated into the Prayer for Thanksgiving. Throughout seminary we gathered for a combined Lutheran/Episcopal worship service in honor of Thanksgiving. It allowed an opportunity to pause in our busyness and gather together in prayer, music, and offerings in thanksgiving for "thy bounties." The hymn below was one that our Lutheran brothers and sisters shared with us. As I stumbled upon it in preparation for this note, it filled me with a feeling of love and warmth, a coziness that only God's love can offer, and a feeling of genuine thanksgiving for the gifts I have been given. It reminded me that while stewardship season can often drudge up feelings of "here we go again"

or "all they ever do is talk about money," the reality is that we are invited to respond to God's abundant blessings with deep JOY. As the second stanza begins,

"with joy the people bring their off'rings round Thy throne,"

it reminds us that we are invited to gather in JOY, with our offerings, knowing that we can give because we have been shown by God how to give.
